Amazing achievement

There has been considerable excitement among the scientific community at the recent arrival of Major Tim Peake at the International Space Station (ISS). What an amazing achievement to build a space station that is orbiting 250 miles above the earth and that supports human beings who are able to 'space walk', and in such a hostile environment. We have seen the beauty and wonder of the stars and the Earth, the 'blue planet' rotating on its axis, beamed to us from the station to our TV's.

Undoubtedly the building of the space station, populated by human being, and the ongoing discovery of amazing information about the universe is indicative of the power and intellect our Creator has given to us. This is true, also, of many other scientific achievements.

Awesome achievement

Whilst all man's accomplishments are to be admired they pale into insignificance when we consider what our Creator has 'achieved' through his infinite power, wisdom, knowledge and understanding *(Psalm 147:5)*. The Genesis account of creation provides a powerful witness to the attributes of God when we read how he created all things, including the Sun and the Moon. In a succinct phrase the writer states that the Creator *'made the stars also' Gen 1:16)*. This is a simple and massive understatement when we consider the extent of the universe and the billions of galaxies containing trillions of stars. God knows not only the number of stars but he has named them all *(Psalm 147:4)*. Surely we can say with the Psalmist *'The heavens declare the glory of God (Gen 19:1)*.

Everything in the universe; its immensity, beauty and wonder, has the signature of a great Designer. All the laws of physics and chemistry and the properties of the cosmos including our own solar system indicate powerfully that life on earth did not happen by itself but was planned.

At the end of the age all who have refused to acknowledge the existence of the Creator will be objects of his wrath and judgment, for creation itself is a profound witness to his power glory and wisdom powerful evidence that should cause people to seek after God.

'For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men, who suppress the truth in unrighteousness, because what may be known of God is manifest in them, for God has shown it to them. For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so they are without excuse' (Rom 1:18-20).

Paul continues to warn those who wilfully reject God and suppress the truth concerning him in the face of such an overwhelming manifestation that creation provides of his existence (v.21-23).

Whilst we admire the accomplishment of men let us also believe in the existence of the God who has made these endeavours possible by granting us the intellectual capacity to apprehend just a small part of his amazing universe. May God also, in the light of creation and our own deep spiritual needs, grant us the grace to seek after him with all our hearts (*Psalm 27:4*), for those who truly seek after him will surely find him (Mat 7:7).

An insight on the holiday experience in the Philippines 2015-2016

Dear all,

Brothers and sisters in the Lord,

This was something new as I have not been back there in the Philippines for a Christmas and new year festive celebration.

My last recollection of this festive season was in 1979 and I was just 15 years old. I've been back before on different occasion mainly some sad passing away of relatives. I sort of knew what to expect but the intensity of it all overwhelmed me, and I'm sure it was not just me but the rest of us, Tess, Charlton and Chermagne. When we arrive we thought the best idea was to eat and have some the well known (Halo-Halo). No its not the game "halo", this was some ice cold fruity desert served in a glass with jellies and sweetened fruit and sweet paste yam, beans, banana slices topped with ice cream and evaporated milk poured on the top. This was a meal in itself, at 4am half an hour after arrival in Manila. We felt this was necessary so that we could cool off after being hit by temperatures that feels like after a winter walk then you go in a house fully heated and you're dying for a cold drink. I was tempted to say, I'm home at last (Philippines) but it didn't feel that way at all, hours later I felt like going back to England, I was home sick (weather wise).

We were able to visit CRBC and met pastor Brian and Necy Ellis that was on the last Sunday that we were there, that was the third week. Our first week was with family and relatives, second week recovery period high blood pressure and other illnesses like coughs that myself, Tess still suffers from, although I believe it is now clearing up. CRBC is a big place it can probably take 200 people comfortably it is set at a higher level than the road which means they are safe when the rainy season floods the road level, and they have a large eating area in the lower part of the buildingto the side a it has roof to shade them from the soaring heat of the Sun. Access to CRBC is good since they are near the main road and there are sign pointing as to where it can be found, once your in the road where it is, it can't be missed it's bigger than DBC. But of course it is the word preached that matters and not the size of the building and yes the Gospel is preached at CRBC.

The festive experience was good, although I wish it was a wee bit cooler, 20'c to 30'c in the morning and a little bit more after noon time, now is it hot or is it really hot? Well that's not even summer time! I need to be a bit fit and not fat next time I go.

- We are returning to the lovely Letton Hall, Norfolk a big old country house with lovely grounds and its own go kart track!!
- We are going from Monday May 30th to Friday June 3rd. This is half term week and the schools are closed so we will be able to accommodate all families
- Everybody is welcome to come. There are no age restrictions. As in the past, guests from outside of DBC are welcome
- We will have our usual mix of fellowship, teaching and fun
- We will be looking after ourselves again so there will be copious amounts of excellent food, lovingly prepared by teams of hardworking holiday makers. This year we intend to reduce or possibly even eradicate the amount of work done by our senior residents
- You will have plenty of time to explore the beautiful Norfolk countryside and we have already arranged for two sessions of karting
- We are due to announce our guest speaker in the next week or so •

Finances for 2015

The overall situation for the Church finances in 2015 was as follows:

Income	£57,108	
Expenditure	£ <u>100,432</u>	(includes £64,474 payments for building work)
Net Payments	£ <u>43,324</u>	

We thank the Lord for His help during the year. Our ministerial expenses were significantly lower again this year. We have had the expense of an extension to our hall, incorporating refurbished toilets and a new kitchen, with costs still to be paid at the year end. Also we anticipate the expense of a pastor that we would like to be led to and appoint.

One of the factors that has helped our income in recent years is Gift Aid (£8,317 received in 2015 including claims from cash gifts of £20 and less, eligible under the new Small Donations scheme). It is now easy for you (if you are a tax payer) to give and for the Church (and other charities) to benefit from the tax you paid on your gift. If you have not signed a Gift Aid Declaration for your giving to the Church, and are able to do so, please speak to David Woodruff (in confidence).

If you give regularly via your bank or building society you may not have reviewed your level of giving for a while. Please prayerfully assess whether you need to make a change to your giving in line with how the Lord has provided for your income over recent months. This may be to increase it or decrease it. Gift Aid can be used in a flexible way.

We would thank all who have made donations over the last year to the work of the Church and would thank the Lord for all that He has given to us. We pray that He will continue to provide for <u>all</u> our needs, spiritual and material, for the Lord's work here in Dunstable, over the coming year.
