Dear Friends,

New Year is often stock taking time for businesses and it is a time for Christians to take stock and trace the good hand of the Lord in all the blessings we have enjoyed even in the midst of the flaws and blemishes of our lives. It is a time also to thank God and rejoice for those things he has enabled us to achieve for the furtherance of his kingdom. As we look forward to a new year of opportunity, privilege, responsibility and fresh consecration to the Lord it does us good to remind ourselves of some aspects of his nature to encourage us as we seek to serve him.

A faithful God

Jeremiah declares that regardless of the circumstances of God's people he always remains faithful and compassionate. He writes 'Through the LORD's mercies we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness' (Lam 3:22-23). As we review our lives we know how often we have failed God and been 'faithless' but how thankful we are that 'He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself' (2 Tim 2:13). This new year we have opportunities to discover and experience more of God's love, compassion and faithfulness.

A forgiving God

In terms of the eternal consequences of sin those who trust in Christ have been forgiven and reconciled to God. John writes that 'the blood of Jesus Christ ... cleanses from every sin' (v.7). But, in terms of our daily relationship with God 'If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness' (1 John 1:9). However, we need to be honest, especially as we evaluate our lives over the past year. 'For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation' (2 Cor 7:9-10).

A forgetting God

Not only does God forgive sins but he forgets them. There is a three-fold promise found in the new covenant for all who repent of sin and turn in faith to Jesus, 'I will be their God, and they shall be my people. ... I will forgive their iniquity, and their sins I will remember no more' (Jer 31;33-34). If there is genuine sorrow for sin, accompanied by a desire to turn away from them, and if God remembers them no more why should we be weakened by a sense of guilt associated with them? In this new year, and indeed each new morning, let us ask God to give us tender consciences, grace to resist temptation and Holy Spirit vigour to serve our risen Lord through the power of his resurrection (*Phil 3:10*).

As we consider our lives, over the past year, let us come to our God who is a faithful, forgiving and forgetting heavenly Father and resolve, in the coming year, to use all the means that he has given to please him and honour our Lord and Saviour. May we remind ourselves of God's many past blessing knowing as we step out in faith he will graciously continue to bless us as we seek to worship and serve him.

News from the Dunstable foodbank

This month's newsletter included the following ...

"I came across a 13-year-old who had used the Foodbank. It had been some time previously (within the last couple of years) when home life had become difficult and out of hand. There was little money at home because Mum was not coping and so not working. Dad was not always working, although he left the house as if going to work. And then Dad was not around at the weekend - using the family money to drink the time away. Wider family had been supportive, but Mum was reluctant to ask for help and relationships with them were strained.

The son noticed one day that there was food in the house that had come from Sainsbury's, but knew that they didn't usually shop there. And there was black writing on the packs of food - so he asked about where the food had come from. Initially Mum was reluctant to talk about it: she was embarrassed to have accepted the hand out. People would think they were poor. But once Mum had given the explanation, she took her son along to the Foodbank the next time they went. He recalled being given the bags of food, and then being offered toothpaste and other extra treats, which they decided to accept since they were on offer. He then went on to explain to me how things are okay now. Dad has moved out, although he is still around and involved. Mum is back at work and earning, and able to manage her finances so that they have enough to eat, pay their bills and they even managed to save up enough to go away for a short camping holiday (eating on holiday was a bit like living on Foodbank, he suggested!)

If you met him, you wouldn't suspect that he had lived on food from the Foodbank. But it's a tale of how the Foodbank was there for a family when they needed it and helped to get them back on their feet and independent once again"

BUILDING UPDATE



The new granite looking gloss worktops have been installed and look fabulous. Two new sinks have been installed and are just waiting for the final plumbing to be done. The new fridge is in position and we are awaiting the new dishwasher to be delivered. The new Lincat EB₃F water heater has been delivered and will used beside one the hatch serving the church, the existing Lincat will be re-used beside the hatch for the church hall.



The new hatch roller shutter doors have been ordered, and we are waiting for them to be installed on si



installed on site, to finish off the kitchen.

New Church Kitchen

Work has progressed with the new kitchen with the kitchen units now fully fitted. We now have plenty of storage space with numerous cupboards and two new 3drawer units for cutlery and cooking utensils.

New Church Hall Layout

The old toilets have now been demolished and the remaining internal walls removed, to reveal the true size of the new church hall. The builders have blocked up the old openings and the first fix has been completed in readiness for the plastering work to begin in earnest. This will finish the hall.





The new church lobby has been created with the last structural openings made between the church hall and the church building. This will enable a new walk through corridor between the church and the new church hall. This area will also house two full height cupboards with roller shutter doors for storing all the household cleaning items, i.e. hoover, mop & bucket, cleaning products, toilet rolls, etc.



The builder has now cut away and demolished the raised concrete platform in line with the doorway into the new church lobby. This is mandatory to comply with the new DDA Disability access regulations. This will allow any wheelchair user to access all parts of the church and access the new disabled toilet, without steps.

Dear Friends,

Moving flats was quite quick. We hired a company to do the work for us. Two young guys came with a lorry and did the job in five hours. Tomek and Mateusz spent the weekend with grandparents. On Sunday evening they came to see the new flat for the first time. Mateusz was so happy while Tomek was a bit disappointed. But after a week he changed his mind. And for the next couple of days after the move we were sleeping on mattresses. There was no point in unpacking as Andrzej's dad wanted to come and redecorate the flat a little bit. So gradually we were able to unpack some boxes and go back to our daily routine. At the moment of writing my day is drilling holes in the wall for the baseboards. When he finished we then will be able to put childrens' bank bed there. And that will be the second room that is finished. And in January dad wants to come and do the living room. At the moment we do not have any furniture for the living room so it would be a good moment to refurbish it next month. And the rest we hope to do in summer time.

On 21st of November we had a seminar about evolution and creationism. We invited a brother from Biblical Institute of Creationism and he did an excellent job. His lectures were interesting and demanding. And there were a few people that came. We hope to repeat it next year with new material to cover.

Jola decided to leave us. She started attending Evangelical Church (KECH) in Warsaw and that is encouraging.

There are three new people that are attending our services regularly. Maria is an Ukrainian lady who is living and working in Legionowo. She is Baptist and she understands Polish but she cannot speak it so sometimes we have a difficulty in understanding her. And also there is a married couple from Belarus - Andrzej and Anastasia. They are born again believers, Baptists as well, with charismatic background. They are living, studying and working in Warsaw. Actually Andrzej is a camera operator and he is looking for a job. Please pray that God would meet their needs.

We hoped that this year we will be able to organize carol singing in the shopping mall in Legionowo. But because of lack of help due to ilnesses we were not able to do that. But we managed to do the Carols by Candles. The group was small but the atmosphere was very pleasant. Andrzej has done a video from this event so maybe we will be able to put it on our website soon.

Because our living room is spacious we decided that we will invite people for the Christmas Eve. And there will be around ten people including Andrzej and Anastasia, Piotr and Anetta, kids, and Anetta's mom. And after the meal we are going to have Pasterka - a night service starting at 9 pm.

Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name "Immanuel" (which means, God with us). Matt. 1: 23 We wish you blessed Christmas and Happy
