Dear Friends,

f you watch the TV or listen to the radio it won't take you long to notice the frequent misuse of the Lord's name. The nine o'clock watershed seems to make no difference where this is concerned. Likewise, whenever you venture out to a public place you will hear people blaspheming the Lord's name. How it grieves us that even young children are misusing the name of God, just as much as adults do. Blasphemy has gradually slipped into the nation's vocabulary over recent years, so that today it has become the thoughtless norm of most people.

Scripture explains why this is the case. In Romans chapter three Paul quotes from Psalm 36:1 and says, "There is no fear of God before their eyes". There is no fear because there is no knowledge. In Hosea 4:1 the Old Testament prophet describes the people of his day, "There is no truth, or mercy or knowledge of God in the land". How like our present generation this is, and what an indictment it is upon the church of Jesus Christ, in that we have been guilty, to a great extent, of keeping the truth about God to ourselves. Ignorance of God has fostered blasphemy.

How many people today would be able to list the Ten Commandments? Not many could recite the words of the third one, "You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain" (Exodus 20:8; Deuteronomy 5:11). So many today would not even have heard of the commandments of God. Those laws that He gave to His people, and for a number of vital reasons: to keep His people safe in the midst of an unsafe world, to reveal His perfect character and standards, to show them that they were incapable in and of themselves of meeting His standards, and therefore, to help them realise why they needed a perfect Mediator and Saviour, who could represent them before Him.

There are at least three general ways in which people take the Lord's name in vain. The first is by using it as a swear word. Or more commonly today, as a replacement for a swear word. 'Oh my...' is the first thing on so many lips when they receive a surprise, become annoyed or feel pain. How ironic it is, that in those moments when the words 'God' or 'Jesus' are used in this way, the person using them is actually giving no thought whatsoever to the One of whom they are speaking. If they were, they wouldn't dare to speak of the Lord in that awful way.

Secondly, people sometimes blaspheme by way of a joke. For most comedians today it seems that Christianity is very much regarded as fair-game, and furnishes them with plenty of material for their so-called humour. I wonder how many who joke about God realise that the reason they are able to get away with what they do, is because God is very gracious and patient. Would that those entertainers realised that they are making fun of their Creator and Judge.

Thirdly, and this may come as a surprise to us, people use God's name in vain when they are being hypocritical. In Jeremiah 12:2 the prophet is talking to the Lord and describing the people of Judah, "...You are near in their mouth, but far from their heart". So in the professing church there are many who are blaspheming the name of God. They should know much better of course, but they don't. No wonder someone has written, 'The profanity of the church is infinitely worse than the profanity of the street'. They are speaking the right words to try and impress God in church, or impress others who are with them in church, but they are really just actors. They are playing a part, not living a life. They are not living a real Christian life where God is both 'the desire' of their heart and 'the king' of their heart. As members of Dunstable Baptist Church, how we all need to ensure that we are not taking the Lord's name in vain, for any of the three reasons that have been briefly described above. Instead, how we should be seeking to live and speak, as those who honour, magnify and glorify the Lord's powerful and wonderful name!

Church Hall extension

After a slow start due to the Archaeological Investigation (more of that later) Nick Wilson Building started work on site in early May. The church hall extension is now well underway with the brickwork almost complete. The new extension will give the church much needed space for the hall, extra storage rooms and compensate for the loss of floor space once the new toilet facilities are installed. Because the building is located next to a Grade II listed church, we are working closely with the Listed Buildings Conservation Officer in matching the bricks, windows, doors, roof slates and gutters to ensure the new build is in sympathy with the existing. The builder is working the new roof using reclaimed Welsh roof slate to satisfy the Listed Building Planning consent.

Archaeological Investigation

One of the many planning conditions that we have to meet, to ensure approval from the Central Bedfordshire planners, is that we conduct an Archaeological Investigation on the site of the proposed church hall extension. DBC employed Headland Archaeology of Wrest Park, Silsoe to conduct the investigation on our behalf. The proposed church hall extension sits in an area of interest to Archaeologists due to the connections to medieval and Roman history.

When the builder started excavating for the foundations of the new extension, we were obliged to have an archaeologist on site to monitor anything of note. The Archaeologist found remains of medieval housing within the chalk layer and the human remains of a young adult. These remains were exhumed under licence granted to us byMinistry of Justice, London and the remains been taken off site to be examined and dated by Headland Archaeology

We as a church were then the focus of the local newspaper, Dunstable Gazette, with the human remains featuring on the front page of the Gazette and online (DunstableToday).



The online headline for the Gazette reads:

Church stunned as child's bones are dug up

"The remains of a child which could date back 500 years have been unexpectedly discovered in the grounds of a church, the Gazette can exclusively reveal.



A skull, shoulders, arms and ribs were uncovered along with nails from a coffin by an archeologist while builders dug the footing for an extension to Dunstable Baptist Church, on St Mary's Gate.

Evidence suggest that the remains, which were situated away from the

church's burial ground, originate from the post medieval period between the 16th and 18th centuries."

The human remains will be reburied, with dignity, within the chapel grounds as a requirement of the exhumation licence granted to us.

Structural work is underway within the church hall







Part of the building refurbishment involves structural alterations to the church hall to accommodate a bigger hall. This will involve installing a large span steel beam, steel columns and concrete foundations to allow internal walls to be demolished. This will allow the church hall to be opened up with a large hall space.

As usual many Travellers come to Epsom Races, so many



profitable conversations were had with these folk. Many will have relatives who they tell you are 'born again', but sadly as many cannot read their commitment and growth in the Lord can be somewhat shallow. As usual we struck up a good rapport with a nearby muslim trader opposite us called Mohamed selling clothes. He spoke with various of our team, and went away with a Pilgrimage booklet. He certainly heard the gospel for several hours – do pray that the Lord will apply what he heard to his heart.


