Dear Friends.

Important decisions have been made for the future political status and relationship of the United Kingdom with the European Union after the completion of the marathon negotiations Mr Cameron has had in Brussels with the leaders of its member states. The result of these negotiations will affect, in some way, all of our lives. How should we react as Christians to not only the rather truncated concessions the Prime minister has gained for the UK, but to the European Union in principle? These are complex issues which involve the question of how we as individual believers should vote when the referendum takes place. The issue is clear - yes, to remain in the Union based on what concessions Mr Cameron has negotiated, no, regardless of these concessions, or not to vote at all.

To vote or not to vote?

The comments I made prior to General Election apply to the coming National Referendum. We cannot meaningfully engage in prayer for those in authority over us, as Paul exhorts us to (1 Tim 2:1-2), or for our nation, and take no part in influencing a decision that will have a profound affect on all of us. We have the responsibility and the freedom to vote and we should use this franchise that has been won for us, sometimes at great cost. We cannot complain, at the outcome of the referendum, if we fail to exercise our vote according to our Christian conscience after prayerfully considering the options. Are there any biblical principles to consider as we exercise our right to vote?

Biblical principles

One of the three great judgments on mankind was the dispersion of the people from Babel when they sought to build a 'tower whose top is in the heavens' and make a name for themselves so they would **not** 'be scattered abroad over the face of the earth' (Gen 11:4). God had other designs for the people in their rebellion against him (v.6). He divided them into different clans, cultures, languages and geographical locations (v.9). Hence, the reason why there are different nations, languages and cultures in the world today. (The ejection from Eden and the flood are the other two great judgments).

Paul in proclaiming the gospel at the Areopagus in Athens declares that God 'has made from one blood (Adam) every nation of men ...and had determined their preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings, so that they should seek the Lord ... and find him' (Acts 17:25-29).

We acknowledge that God is directing the affairs of this world, including Europe, and he will overrule for his own wise and holy purposes. However, we do need to pray that his will shall be done and consider prayerfully how we should vote. May God grant us all wisdom as the result of the referendum will shape this country's destiny and that of our children for generations to come.

From Tim Snuggs - Caring For Life

Its over 8 years ago that I felt a such a strong call from God to relocate to Leeds for a year and offer myself as a Time For Jesus volunteer at Caring For Life. After spending the year working on all sorts of projects I was able to join the staff team working as a waiter in a cafe we had just opened, with the aim of raising additional funds for the charity. My role has evolved somewhat over the last few years as our social enterprise has grown from a small daytime coffee & cake cafe to a full restaurant, farm shop and garden nurseries. Now, within the Accounts team, my role consists of looking after the technology we use as a business such as the till points and all the computer work that comes with buying, selling and producing products.

Over the last 4 or so years I have been increasingly working with a gentleman in our care called Michael, who has a fascination with figures, spreadsheets, computers and barcodes! This couldn't describe my working life any better... And so its been an absolute joy (most of the time?) to encourage Michael to take on as many of my tasks as he can cope with and to support him to do just that. Anyone who spends any money on our farm will have their money counted, reconciled and banked by me and Michael and the sense of responsibility and achievement this gives him is amazing. Michael is incredibly bright but extremely poorly and vulnerable and without Caring For Life would struggle to function outside of full-time care.

Please can I thank you for the prayerful and financial support you offer me and Caring For Life, as a church and as individuals. Thank you to those of you who attend your local CFL support group. Thank you to those of you who have visited us, on a Supporter's Day or whilst in the area. It encourages me to see Dunstable folk visiting, but I am aware of so many prayers and interest in our work so Thank You.
