A Healthy Body and a Sound Church

At times the church may look and behave like an organisation, similar to other clubs and societies. The Bible teaches, however, that the church is an organism: a body in which inter-connected individuals share a common life. The church is the body of Christ (Eph 1:23; 5:30; Rom 12:5; 1 Cor 10:16; 12:12-30 etc.), made up of members who share new life in Christ. This means more than that the church is 'like a body' or 'can be compared to' a body. It is a body and therefore functions like a body.

We call a body which functions properly or well 'healthy.' Sometimes churches are healthy and sometimes they are unwell. In Revelation chapters 2 and 3, we are presented with seven churches in varying degrees of health and sickness. One is even described as 'dead' (Rev 3:1), meaning it is on the point of dying (v. 2). Strong remedies were needed to bring it back to health. As with the health of the body, prevention is better than cure, so it is worth asking how we can stay healthy. What makes for a healthy church? As with any body, it needs good diet, and exercise but not overwork.

What is good diet for a church? Good teaching is often described as spiritual nourishment in the New Testament (e.g. 1 Peter 2:2; Hebrews 5:14). In Titus 2:1, Paul refers to 'sound' teaching. The word he uses does not mean what we usually think of as 'sound.' He does not mean doctrinally orthodox, but healthgiving. Of course, heresy cannot promote spiritual health, but doctrinally orthodox or correct teaching is not what Paul has in mind, nor does teaching that is simply correct necessarily promote spiritual health for the individual or the church. We need teaching that encourages spiritual growth and development in Christian grace. As we all know, some of the most appealing food is not the most healthy. Similarly, the fact that we enjoy a particular kind of teaching does not necessarily make it good for us. We may like to hear our favourite topics covered in preaching, or for the preacher to criticise certain groups or individuals. We may enjoy having our emotions stirred or hearing interesting and amusing anecdotes. We may feel content if the correct doctrinal words or phrases are used. And yet, has it promoted the spiritual well-being of the individual or the church? We also know that a good diet is only half the story. We also need to exercise, otherwise even the healthiest food will not benefit us as it should. An active church is a healthy church.

What is secret of church growth? If the church is a body, we can say that health produces growth. A healthy church will grow. An unhealthy church will dwindle. The key to church growth is to promote spiritual health. What are the signs of a healthy church? This could be answered in many ways, but a quick health check is to compare our church with the description of church life in Acts 2:42. Attention to the teaching of the apostles, fellowship, breaking bread and prayer should be the core activities of any church. These are not the only activities a church is involved in, nor can the health of a church be gauged simply by how many meetings it holds, but whether these are its core activities – the things which are indispensible and essential.

If we understand the church as a body, this helps us also to know what to expect from it and how to look after it. It also reminds us that, as parts of a body, we all matter, that we are inter-connected, and that our individual spiritual well-being is best served by working to promote a healthy church.

Last month we had a chance to meet a new missionary couple who started working in Warsaw - Dariusz and Brooke Bryæko. It's a Polish -American couple who is sent to Poland by a Presbyterian church from the USA. Dariusz is Polish and he is PhD. At the end of this month they are opening a Reformation Study Centre in Warsaw where you can go and read Christian Reformed literature, and drink tea or coffee. They came to our Sunday service and we could also spend some time with them talking and learning about each other by a dinner. Later, it is not specified when, they would like to start a Presbyterian church in Warsaw. Please pray for them We also had a special visit from Maggie and Geoff King. Last year, when we attended Hothorpe, we started talking about Geoff coming to Poland to lead a preaching workshop. So it happened Around eighteen people attended the workshop. We have received a very good feedback. So we praise God for that. Additionally we were able to spend some time with Maggie and Geoff and that was a great encouragement to us. We hope that Geoff will be able to visit us again next year.. So please pray that the Lord would make his visit possible. This coming Saturday we will have a second meeting of School of Systematic Theology. Andrzej will be lecturing the doctrine of God. Please pray for him and all people that will attend that the Lord would bless this event. Andrzej plans to visit Marcin, who is in prison in Warsaw. It can only be done on Thursdays. Last Thursday Andrzej was there but the authorities did not allow him to meet with Marcin.


Christmas

of the arrival of the messiah as the heavenly hosts proclaimed to the shepherds in Luke 2.




Christmas Playlist by Alistair Begg – Good Book Company

Finances for the Third Quarter of 2016

For the third guarter of 2016 the Church finances were as follows:

Income £15,776

Expenditure £22,402

Shortfall £6,626

The reason for the shortfall is that we have paid out £10,533 final bills in connection with the work carried out on our buildings earlier in the year. We are thankful that the Lord provided the resources for us to carry out this work.

We have also had the initial expense of employing Steve Burton amounting to £569 for the last month of the quarter. If there is anyone in the church who would like to contribute towards this expense please bear this in mind when giving to the Church.

We thank all who have given to the work of the Church, over the last quarter, and we would thank our Lord for all He has provided for us. We pray that He will continue to supply all our needs, spiritual and material, for all we do in His name here in Dunstable.

Mission Giving

November is one of our 'Mission Giving' months. Twice a year everyone attending has an opportunity to give specifically to the four Missions which we support. Currently these are:

Andrzej Kempczynski with Grace Baptist Mission (GBM) – involved with church planting in Legionowo in Poland. £500 of our Grace Baptist Mission support is set aside this year for the expenses of the Dropin Camp linked to the Cubao Reformed Baptist Church, which was held recently in October.

The Open-Air Mission (OAM) – with whom Andy Banton, is involved as General Secretary; Frances Burton works in the OAM Office.

Christian literature for Eastern Europe via the Roundwood Trust.

European Missionary Fellowship (EMF) – to support Rogério Ramos in his work in Sines, Portugal.

During November please collect an envelope from the rack by one of the collection boxes and consider prayerfully how you can assist in giving towards the financial needs of the above. Do remember every gift helps however insignificant you think it is. If you do not mark your envelope your gift will be divided equally between the four missions. If, however, you wish to designate your gift, please mark your envelope with the name or names of the work you wish to support and specify how you want the gift divided if you want it to be other than an equal division. Please return your envelopes, via the collection boxes, by the end of November. Tax can be claimed on your mission gifts given by cheque (from those who have signed one of our Gift Aid forms) unless you mark your envelope to the contrary. If it is more convenient for you to spread your giving to these missions over the year then you can do so in the same way as described above; ask for the mission giving envelopes or mark up your own.

In addition some may be interested in supporting the General Fund of the Grace Baptist Mission which helps those workers without fully designated support and the office staff at Abingdon. Please mark any gifts given for this purpose.

As well as financial support, all of the above need everyone's support in prayer, so please bring them before the throne of grace regularly — at home, and at our weekly prayer meetings. There are usually copies of their prayer / news letters in the vestibule, and news from some of these letters is put in the Newsletter from time to time. Please ask Christine Wild (christinewild50@gmail.com), our Mission Secretary, if you want to know more or would like a prayer letter emailed to you. When we have Meetings linked with their work do try and come to show your support. It will then be a greater encouragement to them in their work for the Lord as well as a help to you in your prayers.

Just a note to say **thank you** for your support as I made a very difficult decision to leave the Open-Air Mission, a society I love and owe much to, so that I could serve at Dunstable and Leagrave while training for church-based ministry at London Seminary. I have been touched by the churches kindness in different ways. If you were unable to come to the members meeting you missed me outline what a normal week looks like for me during term time. So below is a rough look of my week but I must say that it is very flexible and changes according to needs:

Monday – I work at Dunstable and help with the Monday Kids Club. On this day I try to do hospital visits to members in need and once a fortnight I meet a member to give youth work training and mentorship.

Tuesday – London Seminary. I start my morning with Hebrew and then, depending on whether it is week A or B I will have Old Testament theology or Systematic Theology classes all day.

Wednesday – London Seminary again. I start the morning with Hebrew again and then have either Preaching or Mission and Evangelism classes. In the afternoon I have voice production lessons.

Thursday – I usually meet Barry King in Leagrave and we do some evangelism. I sometimes also meet Andy Little to do some open-air work. However, I am able to make myself free time and again to help speak at Friends and Neighbours at DBC in the afternoon. It's usually on this day, also, that I meet up with another DBC member to study the Bible.

Friday – I'm working at Dunstable and every other week I meet with Ron Shipton, who is mentoring me, and we study some theology and I shadow him as we go to visit some of the older church members. In the evening I'm usually at the Focus Youth Group.

Come the New Year I will be preaching at Dunstable once a month, on average, during term time. And every three months I will be preaching at Edlesborough/Leagrave, on average. I still volunteer for the monthly DBC open-airs and will no doubt be doing other things as I settle in to the role at Dunstable. I hope to be producing a prayer letter in the New Year to update people about how things are going with news for you to pray. For now, thank you again for your prayers and encouragement.

If you would like to see my job description please speak to David Woodruff who will happily give you a copy. I haven't put everything on it in this note.
