Dear Friends,

Sometime ago when our grandson, who was 3 years old, was staying with us we heard a crash in our bedroom. On investigation we found the lid of a pot laying smashed on the floor. He had been told earlier not to touch things and on asking how the lid got broken our grandson blamed our dog with the reply 'Bobby did it'. After further 'dialogue' he admitted his guilt. Even at his age he acknowledged how absurd his answer was as the pot was located on top of a 'dog unreachable' chest of drawers.

There are a number of principles we can learn about this incident. First, all of us are prone to disobedience. Second, we tend to blame others (even a dog). Third, we all can experience a sense of guilt when we offend in some way.

Damaging Disobedience

We are all prone to disobedience – a sinful and endemic condition of the human heart. We want to do our own thing and have our own way. The allurement of the forbidden is more powerful often than the product of obedience. When Eve ate of the fruit in the Garden in disobedience to a command of God and gave it to Adam to eat they considered that the appeal of being *'like God'* (Gen 3:5) appeared far superior than anything their Creator could give them. However, the sin of disobedience damaged their relationship with God and ultimately all mankind's as well. Disobedience and sin has profound affect.

Disobedience is the result of a rebellious heart and it has eternal consequences. God 'commands all men everywhere to repent' (Acts 17:30). Failure to obey this command will result in separation from God now and in the eternity to come with all the sorrow that will bring.

We know from experience that when disobedience is exposed it can produce many responses. Blaming others and a sense of guilt are but two reactions. Both manifested by Adam and Eve.

Blame Game

From the very beginning our first parents engaged in the usual human trait of blaming someone or something else for sin and failure. Eve blamed the serpent (3:13), and Adam his wife and God (v.12), for their disobedience. How many times have we blamed others to mitigate, at least in our own minds, the sense of failure, guilt and sometimes pain felt by the uncovering of a misdemeanour?

Blaming others is a reaction to our God given consciences that cause us to make excuses for our sinful behaviour, which generates a sense of guilt and a desire to pass responsibility to others. But, we are all aware that it is possible for our consciences to become hardened to the point where a sense of guilt and distaste at what we have done is reduced or even eliminated.

Guilty Conscience

When we are disobedient, and are found out, we can be filled with powerful emotions such as remorse and guilt. When our first parents sinned they hid themselves from the Lord. If they did not feel a sense of guilt they would not have felt the need to hide from him (3:8). They knew they had done wrong. Guilt is a necessary experience for several reasons. First, is it is a proper response to any offence. Most people want a murderer or a burglar to feel remorse or some kind of guilt. Why? Because guilt admits the sin that has been hidden. Second, without it there can be no sense of the need for forgiveness. Guilt drives the previously unrepentant sinner to repent and seek forgiveness from God.

For the believer guilt is the way of reconciliation to our heavenly Father. The apostle John exposes us to the truth of our sin (1 John 1:8) but this knowledge of guilt leads us to a glorious portrayal of forgiveness. 'If we confess our sin, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness' (1 John 1:9). Such is the power of the precious blood of our Saviour that it 'cleanses from every sin' (v.7). When we sin and the Holy Spirit, through the Word of God, exposes our sin and produces an awareness of guilt repentance leads to forgiveness and reconciliation. We then are liberated to begin anew on the path of holiness, joy and usefulness. Suppression of or unconfessed sin is a conduit that leads to lack of joy, fruitlessness and failure in the Christian life. May God help us by his grace not to sin but when we do to experience the joy of repentance and reconciliation.

Jim Sayers visited GBM's missionaries currently studying French in preparation for their future missionary service.

Phil & Carolyn Reid:

Phil & Carolyn returned home last year after serving the Lord in central Asia. God willing, they plan to move in the summer to Piela (3 hours east of Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso).

Carolyn is to work as a doctor in a rural health centre established by a local church. The project is still small but the team are seeking to develop the work and have been praying for a long time for a foreign doctor to join them.

Phil plans to do Bible translation with a new people group (a nomadic people spread across sub-Saharan Africa from Senegal to Sudan). He will join the team working on the Burkina dialect. "In CU the week before we were encouraged to think of friends we could invite to events, and I struggled to think of particular events to invite particular friends to. However, God knew who He wanted me to invite, and He made opportunities for me to explain what was happening during events week even when I had prepared nothing to say. This was a sign of God beginning to work in the hearts of my friends. Two of my friends then came to the coffee and cake bar on the first day, and were very interested in finding out more, so, as you do, I offered to read the Bible and go through some simple studies with them. They agreed straight away! We did the first Uncover study yesterday and I am already amazed at how God is working in their hearts and minds. All of the evening events were great too, the last night being on the cross. The room was overflowing with people and everyone seemed to be really listening, many people asked questions after the talk. Please keep praying for us on campus as we seek to share God's love and gospel with students who don't know Him. Student Alpha and Uncover studies will need to be saturated in prayer, but we trust that God can change lives, and it is incredible that He wants to use us in the process!"

Tour of the Palace of Westminster Thursday 4th April 2013

Elizabeth Tower Tour

Dunstable Foodbank

Two letters received from Peter Meadows, Operations Manager of the Foodbank.

Dear Foodbank Supporters,

I've received a number of replies to my earlier e-mail requesting more specific details of food requirements. As the warehouse team have now completed a stocktake, I can say that we have enough pasta / spaghetti, baked beans & tins of soup! We have particularly low stocks of tinned fish (except tuna), long life milk, fruit juice. and mashed potato. However, we have just completed another week of high demand and food continues to be distributed to those in need at double the rate that we are collecting it. Our normal list of non-perishable food is

attached for reference. Your continued support and prayers are very much appreciated and are essential to the continued operation and suc-

cess of Foodbank.

Dear Foodbank supporters,

As you may know, the demand for Dunstable Foodbank has grown strongly recently. In the 28 weeks since the Foodbank started, we have distributed over 7,700 meals to more then 850 clients, with more than half of these in the last 8 weeks. As a result, despite the regular donations that we have received, our stock of food has been depleted and we must replenish this. Therefore we have made arrangements with some local supermarkets to hold collections. Because of the urgent need, the
