Dear Friends,

We are living in perplexing times. There is growing moral, spiritual and political confusion exacerbated by mass communication and the economic situation. The society is also experiencing information overload. One tabloid recently provided a two-page pullout with 500 new applications (apps) for electronic devices. Simply by touching a desired icon on, for instance, an ipad a mass of data is produced instantly. Faced with an unimaginable array of facts, experiences, ideas and feelings how do we make sense of reality and especially moral reality? However, though many have moved away from the Bible, and its guiding principles, that have earlier informed and formed the moral fabric of society, and our consciences, many people are not satisfied with the 'new order' and are still searching for the purpose and meaning of life. Of course that meaning cannot be found within the confused values and disorder of society but only in the Creator, even as light cannot be found in a dark room.

One example of lack of moral direction is found in the concept of love although most people accept the idea of love as some kind of ultimate value of life. The problem is, however, that there are two broad approaches to love.

What people want

One of the moral issues that has arisen today is that it is hardly possible to disagree with someone about a number of issues without being accused of a lack of love. For many people real love means to be prepared to approve the desires and decisions of others and even help them fulfil them. Children accuse parents of not loving them if they do not get or do what they want. Though as flawed human beings we occasionally act against our better judgment most parents will make decisions for the best interests of their offspring. However, in society it is considered 'phobic' to disagree with or disapprove of behaviour contrary to biblical teaching and the fundamental laws of nature. The apostle Paul teaches about these things in Romans (1:24-31). This is merely one example of many that can be cited to show that the present moral condition of society is not a foundation to make ethical decisions about human conduct and behaviour – ethical decisions that are now or will be enshrined in legislation. It is not unloving to want the best for those who we disagree with.

What people need

The biblical view of love is to will and to do what is good for society and people and to help them achieve that good. It is not loving to approve of something that harms people. There is a great difference between a 'desire' and that which is 'desirable' – the 'want' and the 'good'. As fallen creatures we cannot look within ourselves to determine the difference. As I have written earlier it is impossible to find light in a dark room. Only as we look into the perfect Word of God (James 1:25), the Bible, do we have a source of light that is outside of ourselves to determine and distinguish between what is desirable and good and that which is destructive and detrimental to our society and to the individual members of it.

The greatest act of love is found in God who is not people 'phobic' simply because in his Word he has condemned them as sinners, (their thoughts, words and actions are destructive to their lives now and in the eternity to come), far from it. Why? Because 'God demonstrates his own love towards us, in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us' (Rom 5:8). Surely to give one's life to save a friend epitomises the greatest act of love but God's love is greater in that he has manifested his love towards his enemies (Rom 5:10). If it is wise and good for human beings to be willing to express their concern about the self-damaging behaviour of their fellow creatures how much more is it wise and loving for God to communicate his concern about the behaviour, and its outcome, of those who he has created.

BRITISH MUSEUM VISIT



On Saturday 18th May, we assembled at the British Museum, London, for a tour kindly given by Keith Berry about the ancient empires that existed during Bible times. We began by having a look at the Assyrian Empire, and saw some fascinating wall engravings from Assyrian palaces in Nimrud and Nineveh. Then, we visited the section of the museum dedicated to Ancient Greece. We saw busts of the Greek philosophers, and learned about the Mausoleum of Halikarnassos, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, Next came the exhibits on the Chaldeans, the ancient civilization that included the city of Ur. Around this time we also saw the proclamation of Cyrus that al-

lowed the Jewish people to return to Jerusalem. We ended the tour with a look at a replica of the Rosetta Stone, a translation of which allowed European scholars to begin to understand the Egyptian script of Hieroglyphics.

After lunch, we moved onto a tour of the East End of London. We began at the border between the City of London and the East End. Keith told us about the many waves of immigrants that had settled in the area, including Huguenots (French Protestants who had been persecuted by the Catholics), Jews, and more recently, Bengalis. In particular, we toured Spitalfields, an area of London that has gone through many stages of urban regeneration, going from a very run-down area to almost being an extension of the built-up City of London. Following on from the tour of Spitalfields, we had refreshments at a coffee shop being run by local Christians on Brick Lane, before going home after a very enjoyable day.
