## **Psalm 45 - Devoted to the King**

The writer of Psalm 45 was stirred up with great enthusiasm to write a song in celebration of a royal wedding. We may love the pageant and spectacle of a royal wedding or coronation, but in ancient Israel, such ceremonies had even greater significance. The king wielded all the power over the nation: he was at the head of the legal system, ran the economy and led the army. Most of all he had the responsibility to keep the nation true to her covenant with God. Having a good king mattered a great deal! It is possible, however, that Psalm 45 was written for Ahab and Jezebel, two of Israel's worst monarchs! If this is so, we may wonder why this psalm is preserved in Scripture. The answer may lie in the hopes which it raised, which remained unfulfilled by any king and through which God promised a truly perfect king—the Messiah. As Christians, we see Psalm 45 fulfilled in Jesus Christ and his Church.

### **The beauty of Christ**

The hearts of Christians should be stirred as we contemplate Christ. The picture in this psalm of a king in full military regalia may seem a long way from the image in our minds of the carpenter from Nazareth, but the character of the king described here is fully realised in Jesus:

- his lips have been anointed with grace - no-one ever spoke like Jesus (John 7:46; Mt 7:28-29)
- awesome deeds on behalf of truth, humility and righteousness - see Mt 4:23-25; Mk 2:10
- a sceptre of justice - see Luke 4:18-19; Lk 5:30-32

Most of all, the words of Ps 45:6 can only be fulfilled in Jesus Christ: he is God the Son, whose kingdom will last forever. These words are applied to Christ in Heb 1:8, 9 (see also Isa 9:6).

Jesus is the 'good shepherd' (John 10:11), the beautiful one, not just one who is morally upright or good at being a shepherd. We need someone to entrust our souls to and we need look no further than him. It is an honour to belong to Christ.

### **The glory of the Church**

In verse 9, the focus shifts from the king to his queen. Ephesians 5:22-33 and Revelation chapters 19-21 encourage us to see the Church as the bride of Christ. Only when Christ returns and takes his people to be with him in heaven will the picture of the bride in Psalm 45 be truly fulfilled. There is at least one aspect of the picture we must take to heart now, however: in v. 10, the bride is told to forget her own people. She came from another nation, but now she is to become an Israelite in all her ways, especially in her allegiance to the one true God. Jesus spoke about the unwavering allegiance we must have to him (Luke 14:25). He did not literally mean that we should hate ourselves or our families, but that we should have no divided loyalties: he comes first!

To remain true to the Lord Jesus, we need to keep being stirred by the noble theme of the glory, majesty and beauty of the Lord Jesus Christ (v. 1). We need to remember his love for the church (v. 11). This will lead us to want to spread abroad the honour of his name (v. 17)

## **Finances for 2013**

The overall situation for the Church finances in 2013 was as follows:

Income	£60,719
Expenditure	<u>£70,332</u>
Shortfall	<u>£9,613</u>

We thank the Lord for His help during the year. Our ministerial expenses were significantly lower again this year, but we did make significantly increased gifts to missions and relief. The planned shortfall was a result of this and has slightly reduced our overall funds which had been too high. We still have the anticipated expense of an extension to our hall, incorporating refurbished toilets, as well as the expense of a pastor that we would like to be led to and appoint.

One of the factors that has helped our income in recent years is Gift Aid (£9,633 received in 2013 including claims from cash gifts of £20 and less, eligible under the new Small Donations scheme). It is now easy for you (if you are a tax payer) to give and for the Church (and other charities) to benefit from the tax you paid on your gift. If you have not signed a Gift Aid Declaration for your giving to the Church, and are able to do so, please speak to David Woodruff (in confidence).

If you give regularly via your bank or building society you may not have reviewed your level of giving for a while. Please prayerfully assess whether you need to make a change to your giving in line with how the Lord has provided for your income over recent months. This may be to increase it or decrease it. Gift Aid can be used in a flexible way.

We would thank all who have made donations over the last year to the work of the Church and would thank the Lord for all that He has given to us. We pray that He will continue to provide for all our needs, spiritual and material, for the Lord's work here in Dunstable, over the coming year.

AND THE NEW 'FRIDAY CLUB' NAME IS...

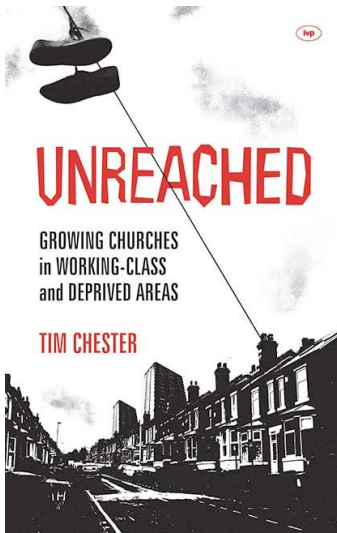
**'IGNITE'**

## UNREACHED BY TIM CHESTER

Think of the thriving evangelical churches in your area, and the chances are that they will be in the nice areas of town and their leaders will be middle class, so starts the marketing promotion on Tim Chester's new book Unreached. What Tim tries to do is show how disconnected some churches are from reaching the deprived, urban, working-class, and often benefits-class, within the estates and schemes of our major towns and cities. The author claims there is a huge chasm between the benefit culture and the evangelical church culture.

The book doesn't claim to offer the final word on this subject but to inject some insight and discussion amongst churches on how they may reach every one with the gospel, regardless of any defining class structure. The book is a result of a collaboration of a working group set up in 2009 called Reaching the Unreached, looking at how churches can reach deprived areas with the gospel.

The book makes the distinction that the first things many middle-class Christians see on estates or schemes are the social problems. These capture our attention, so we think our role is to fix them with social programs like food banks, night shelters, youth schemes, etc. but, what does God see? He sees people for whom he sent his Son. Their fundamental problem is not social programs, but sin. The solution is not social action but Jesus transforming their lives through the gospel.

The book looks at how churches can engage with deprived areas through understanding the culture, key gospel themes for deprived areas, evangelism in deprived areas and more importantly, discipleship in working class and deprived areas. Each chapter gives relevant, helpful advice and testimonials from those on the ground involved in this ministry.

The book highlights the website, <http://www.reachingtheunreached.org.uk>, as a forum for discussion and information. The website has full digital recordings from the 2013 Unreached conference, I especially enjoyed Mez McConell's insights from his work in Scotland with Niddrie Community Church.

Every church pastor and elder should read this book, and reconsider their missional outreach in their neighbourhood amongst those in deprived areas.

Summary of PRAYER WAVES for January 2014



Ian Flanders visit to Burkina Faso:

Ian Flanders: Went to Burkina Faso for around two weeks to teach in two different Bible colleges.

While in Burkina Faso Ian stayed with Daniel Kambou; the director of a local Christian radio station. Daniel's vision for ministry in Burkina Faso is a holistic ministry. They have social programs which tackle a variety of different topics; these programs are currently focusing on the rights of women in the country, child labour and AIDS. The radio station also has Christian programs for edifying the Christian and teaching how to reach out to those who do not know Jesus.

The radio station currently has 14 full time staff, 20 volunteers and broadcasts in 8 languages. Seven of these languages are local and the eighth is French.

The station broadcasts Esperance Aujourd'hui and distributes the booklets. They find that it is really useful and that people appreciate listening to the program and being challenged and encouraged. They distribute the booklets to church leaders in their area to help with their own personal growth and with sermon preparation.

Phil and Carolyn Reed: have been in Burkina Faso since August last year and are currently living in the east of the country where they are learning the local language.

Once his language skills are up to par, Phil is getting involved in Bible translation in the local language. Carolyn will hopefully start work again soon in a health centre or hospital as a doctor, though the details are yet to be fully ironed out.

Prayer Points:

- For Daniel Kambou that he may be able to free up time and concentrate on counselling and follow-up of listeners.
- For the Radio station, that they may make wise choices about their possible sponsorship and that God will provide the money for them to continue.
- That Phil and Carolyn will quickly pick up the local language.
- That the Lord will open up the paths for Phil and Carolyn's future ministry.
