Dear Friends,

No doubt many children (and some parents) have enjoyed the gift of an Easter egg or two over the Easter period. About 80 million chocolate eggs have been consumed costing some £200 million pounds. We are informed that there are 150 million chocolate eggs, bunnies and other chocolate items eaten over Easter. At the same time not many flying hours away people have got precious little to eat.

Inequality

The saying 'we are all born equal' is patently not true when many families eat between three and ten chocolate goodies over Easter whilst others are starving. Such is the imbalance in wealth between the poor and rich nations. Inequality encompasses not only income but also access to food, education, health, shelter, political and religious freedom and much more.

Equality

However, all people are born equal in some respects. We are all made in the image of our Creator (Gen 1:26-27). We are all born with fallen natures manifested in the sins we commit (Rom 3:23). For instance hungry people tell lies and murder, as well as the affluent. We all die and we cannot take anything of this world's possessions with us (1 Tim 6:7). At an appointed time, known only to God (Mark 13:32-37), we shall all, rich and poor, stand before the judgment throne of Christ (Matt 25:31-44; Heb 9:27).

Because God 'has put eternity in our hearts' (Eccl 3:11) we all have an inquisitiveness about eternal realities and a desire to transcend our morality. Deep in our beings, we have an intrinsic sense that there is an eternity to come and a God to face, though this is often unheeded. Some declare their atheism and yet call upon God to help them through difficulties and especially when life is threatened. It has been said 'there are no atheists in foxholes' referring to combatants who are in imminent danger of injury or death.

We all have equal opportunity, in one way or another, (such as the witness of creation, a biblical message or our consciences), to seek after God and receive the assurance of an eternal relationship with him as our heavenly Father.

Over this Easter period, in spite of all the chocolate sweeties eaten, there is a very serious and important issue to understand that has to do with our eternal security. Because our sin has separated us from a holy God he has taken the initiative and provided a means of forgiveness and reconciliation.

Easter is about the profound love of God for his fallen creatures. Its about his great desire to restore the relationship that has tragically been lost because of sin. It is about the amazing gift of the Lord Jesus to give his life to pay the price of sin for all who repent of their sins and trust in him *(Acts 20:21)*. It is about his resurrection from the dead and everlasting life for repentant sinners.

I am not suggesting we should not enjoy the odd Easter egg or sweet. What I am saying is there is something far more fundamental and profound to enjoy - the blessing and joy of knowing God as our heavenly Father and Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour and God's gift of eternal life through faith in him (John 3:16).

Summary of PRAYER WAVES for April 2014

Slavko and Alison Ezdenci

New Belgrade (where Slavko and Alison live) is a concrete jungle of tower blocks and other buildings. The population of New Belgrade is about 400,000 and there is almost no gospel witness in the area. It is in this area that the Ezdenci's have come to plant a new Baptist church.

Slavko and Alison came to Serbia at the start of 2011. They have three children, their third, baby Luka was born on Sunday morning. When they first came to Belgrade, Slavko started working as assistant pastor in the First Baptist Church in Old Belgrade, but their intention was always to plant a church into New Belgrade.

New Belgrade has a lot of communal areas and because everyone lives in flats, locals have little room and no garden and so are out and about most of the time. This and the fact that people are very friendly, makes it very easy to meet people. The culture is all about groups and which groups you belong to, family groups, social groups, neighbours etc.

The church plant started in 2012, with a core group of Christians who lived in the area and they started by equipping them to reach out to their friends. The concept of church planting to the local Christians was new and so they started very slowly. They began by gathering on Wednesday evenings to talk through their reasons and what church planting is. Then they began to equip those who wanted to be involved, they started by taking the group through "Two Ways To Live" and discussing how to answer possible questions. A year ago they held their first Sunday service, originally just once a month, but now meet three out of every four Sundays together.

Slavko has also been involved in the training of leaders in Belgrade and in Novi Sad.

Six children around the table each sticking "God's ten Rules" on a long strip of wall paper took some organisation. The scroll produced reflected the Bible story of Josiah, one of the four Old Testament Kings spoken of in the Bible Time.







The speakers, Andy, Tom, James and Steve dramatically retold the biblical accounts of the four Kings. The children listened well and the answers given in the quiz questions showed that they had paid attention. King Jesus was the theme of the last Bible session. The children's parents had been invited to attend. Praise God so many parents came that there were not enough seats for them and they had to stand in the entrance hall.







Thirty seven children chose to do the craft whereas the rest of them spent their time on the football field. Scott manfully organised both children and helpers. God answered prayer in keeping them safe and injury free. We thank God for His answer to our prayers for good weather, attendance, safety and enjoyment by all.

Ways to give tax effectively to the Church (incl. Mission Giving) - Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer, using Gift Aid means that for every pound you give, the Church gets an extra 25 pence from the government, helping your donation go further. On top of that, if you are a higher rate taxpayer you can claim further tax relief on the donation in your annual tax return.

So next time you want to give to the Church, tell David Woodruff you want to Gift Aid it and he will do the rest (confidentially). You only need to sign a simple Gift Aid form and make your gift by cheque or through your bank.

Finances for the First Quarter of 2014

For the first quarter of 2014 the Church finances were as follows:

Income£15,133Expenditure£22,205Shortfall£ 7,072

The reason we have a shortfall this quarter is that we agreed to make extra donations to missions totalling £12,000. During the quarter we benefited from the receipt of tax reclaimed (£260) on Gift Aid gifts given in the last quarter of 2013 and also from the receipt of tax reclaimed (£1,085) on Gift Aid gifts given over the early part of the quarter. We have just made a claim for a £1,405 tax repayment for the rest of the quarter and some outstanding gifts. During the first quarter we paid £650 to the architect for fees and for the recent planning application, and £450 for a new baptistry heater.

We thank all who have given to the work of the Church, over the last quarter, and we would record our thanks to the Lord for all He has provided for us. We pray that the Lord will continue to supply all our needs, spiritual and material, for all we seek to do in the Lord's name in Dunstable.

Mission Giving

May is one of our 'Mission Giving' months. Twice a year everyone attending has an opportunity to give specifically to the four Missions which we support, which are:

- a. Andrzej Kempczynski with Grace Baptist Mission (GBM) – involved with church planting in Legionowo in Poland. £500 of our Grace Baptist Mission support is set aside this year for the expenses of the Dropin Camp linked to the Cubao Reformed Baptist Church, which is held in October.
- b. The Open-Air Mission (OAM) with whom Andy Banton, is involved as General Secretary; Steve Burton works as an Evangelist and Linda Lumley, Ruth Banton and Tess Barnachea work in the OAM Office.
- c. Christian literature for Eastern Europe via the Roundwood Trust.
- d. European Missionary Fellowship (EMF) to support Rogério Ramos in his work in Sines, Portugal.

During May please collect an envelope from the rack beside one of the collection boxes and consider prayerfully how you can assist in giving towards the financial needs of the above. Do remember every gift helps however insignificant you think it is. If you do not mark your envelope your gift will be divided equally between the four missions. If, however, you wish to designate your gift, please mark your envelope with the name or names of the work you wish to support and specify how you want the gift divided. Please return your envelopes, via the collection boxes, by the end of May. Tax can be claimed on your mission gifts given by cheque (from those who have signed one of our Gift Aid forms) unless you mark your envelope to the contrary. If it is more convenient for you to spread your giving to these missions over the year then you can do so in the same way as described above; ask for the mission giving envelopes or mark up your own.

Once a year in May we are also inviting additional gifts for the <u>General Fund of the Pilgrims' Friend Society</u>. Please use one of the Mission envelopes and mark it 'Pilgrims' Friend Society'. The same comments about Gift Aid apply.

In addition some may be interested in supporting the General Fund of the Grace Baptist Mission which helps those workers without fully designated support and the office staff at Abingdon. Please mark any gifts given for this purpose.

Over and above financial support, all of those mentioned need everyone's support in prayer, so please bring them before the throne of grace regularly – at home, and at our weekly prayer meetings. There are usually copies of their prayer / news letters in the vestibule, and news from some of these letters is put in the Newsletter from to time. Please ask Christine Wild (christinewild50@gmail.com), our Mission Secretary, if you want to know more or would like a prayer letter emailed to you. When we have Church Fellowship Meetings linked with their work do try and come to show your support. It will then be a greater encouragement to them in their work for the Lord as well as a help to you in your prayers.
