# LIVING BELIEF (Rom 16:1-16)

Paul's letter to the church in Rome contains many great and profound truths about the Christian faith. So we might be tempted to view chapter 16 as something of an anticlimax: a list of greetings to people we have never heard of. But these greetings are a vital part of the letter. They remind us that there is no Christian belief unless there are Christian believers. Romans 16 anchors the great truths of the letter in the real world of church life and Christian relationships. Christianity is as much about Christian people as it is about the Christian message.

# DIVERSITY

Considering Paul had never been to the Roman church, he knew a lot of people there. There is a great diversity among the people Paul greets in Romans 16:

- both men and women, married couples and individuals are among those Paul greets
- there are people of Jewish, Asian, Greek and Roman backgrounds
- a number of those Paul greets would have been household slaves (several of the names suggest this).
- some were members of very prestigious households in Rome (Aristobulus and Narcissus) cf. Phil 4:22.

Wherever there is such diversity, differences of opinion and tensions arise (as we see in chapter 14). The church would have met in homes (v. 5), creating even more possibilities for factions to form in the church. And yet there was unity. There is room for diversity of opinion within the church, without losing unity.

### JOINT PARTAKERS

The basis of Christian unity is also found in these verses. Paul speaks to those who, like him, were 'converts' to the Christian faith, those 'in Christ' or 'in the Lord', those he looked upon as brothers, sisters, even one woman he regarded as a 'mother' (v. 13). This does not just mean that Paul was a warm-hearted character who loved people. It means that he considered that they all belonged together, like members of one family, because of their faith in Jesus Christ. It is human nature to group together with people who share our background, interests and outlook. It is Christian nature to group together with those who share our faith in Christ.

### JOINT PARTICIPATORS

The most striking thing about the list of people Paul greets is that they had all participated in the work of the gospel. Four women are singled out as having 'worked hard' (vv. 6, 12). Two people had risked their lives (v. 4); two others had been imprisoned for their faith (v. 7). Some opened their homes for use by the church (v. 5). All of them had helped Paul in some way. Church leaders depend on the support and backing of all the members of the church and Paul is happy to acknowledge that.

Romans 16 reminds us that we shape each other's Christian lives and experience. We bless each other and, sometimes, we bruise one another. The blessings should outlive the bruises: we must learn to forget the frictions and tensions and remember the ways in which we have been helped. We must not take for granted the experience we have of Christian fellowship and church life: it makes us what we are.

# 2ND VISIT TO THE MILITARY INTELLIGENCE MUSEUM AT CHICKSANDS > MONDAY 27TH OCTOBER <

Those of us who went on the visit to the Military Intelligence Museum in July enjoyed the visit to this fascinating museum, and we found that there was much more exhibits and displays than we were able to see in the time available. We have arranged for a second group visit to the Military Intelligence Museum at DISC Chicksands, near Shefford. This museum is not normally open and visits must be prebooked.

You are welcome to join us if you like to return to see more or if you missed out on our previous visit.

The Military Intelligence Museum displays key elements of the history of British Military Intelligence from the Boer War forwards. The central Collection in the Museum is the Intelligence Corps Collection, which includes artefacts and special exhibits about the history and activities of the Corps. The second key Collection is the Medmenham Collection devoted to aerial photography and image analysis. This highlights the use of 3D imagery, initially in the First World War and then again with huge success in World War II and the Cold War. Complementing these two prime displays are two smaller displays. These cover the joint service 'BRIXMIS' intelligence-gathering mission based in East Germany during the Cold War and the American radio intercept operations in Chicksands from 1950 until 1996.

#### VISIT ARRANGEMENTS

There is no charge for visiting the museum, although donations from visitors are welcome. We are booked to arrive at the Military Intelligence Museum for 10:30. The visit to the museum will probably last 2-3 hours and then we can have a break for some lunch, before going on a walk in the Shefford area during the afternoon, weather permitting. This museum is located inside a working military base with high security, so we need to provide some information in advance (e.g. Names, Dates of Birth and Car details). Each person will need to bring an official ID (e.g. Passport, Photo Driving Licence) to gain access. 
