Dear friends,

Reading a book about heaven I found the following in a chapter 'Preparing for Heaven'.

'An Indiana cemetery has a tombstone, more than one hundred years old, with the following epitaph:

"Pause, stranger, when you pass by: As you are now, so once was I. As I am now, so you will be, So prepare for death and follow me."

An unknown passer-by scratched these additional words on the tombstone:

"To follow you I am not content, Until I know which way you went."

Two destinations. The Bible refers constantly to one of two destinations when a person dies. One a place of suffering, sorrow and regret, the other a place of joy, bliss and love. This truth is expressed plainly by the Lord concerning the rich man and Lazarus (*Luke 16:19-31*).

Two ways. To arrive at any destination it is necessary to travel a certain way. In his parable about the broad way and the many who are found on it the Lord warns 'that it leads to destruction.' He also encourages those who are on the narrow and difficult way 'that it leads to life' (Matt 7:13-14).

Two alternatives. Occasionally the Bible quotes a verse or passage several times thus emphasising the importance of what is being taught. Prov 14:12 and 16:25 both state 'There is a way that seems right to man. But its end is the way of death.' This is one alternative, that which seems right to a person that leads to death eternal, conscious separation from a holy God. The other alternative is to 'trust in the living God, who is the Saviour of all men (all kinds of men and women), especially of those who believe' (1 Tim 4:10) that leads to eternal, conscious union with Christ - the risen Lord and Savour.

Two messages. One message concerns those who do not believe the gospel or seek after God 'let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die' (1 Cor 15:32). Many consider that life is all about living for pleasure and then death (Isa 22:13). However, the Bible teaches that, after death, there is a judgment 'And it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment' (Heb 9:27). A judgment for some that leads, as we have seen, to eternal separation from God. The other message is about God's compassion for people revealed in the life and work of Jesus Christ who had such love for sinners he was willing to pay the price of sin by his death on Calvary's cross (1 Cor 6:20) so that all who trust him will receive eternal life (John 3:16; 1 John 5:11-12).

Two messengers. There are those who deny the existence of God and peddle what is basically, for some, a message of despair and for others ambivalence or stoicism. Some of these tell us that there is no absolute truth and that everything is relative (except, of course, the statement that there is no absolute truth). However, here is one absolute truth repeated for emphasis in the Bible 'The fool has said in his heart, there is no God' (Psalm 14:1; 53:1). Not referring to the unintelligent but rather those who wilfully reject the evidence of God, even in the wonder of creation (Rom 1:18-20).

However, we who have received the message of salvation in Christ have the duty of love and responsibility to minister the same message to those who are without Christ, without forgiveness, without hope and without eternal life. This is not an optional extra, as we were hearing recently, but a command from our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ to 'Go .. and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit' (Mat 28:18-20).

God is pleased to use those who were once without hope to bring the message of hope to those who are yet without it (2 Cor 4:7). What a joy, privilege and responsibility we have, as servants of God, to be used by him for the spread of the gospel. But are we willing to go even as the Lord commanded?
