Dear Friends

The birth of Jesus Christ was a momentous occasion. Jesus' birth shows that God would go to the greatest lengths to save his people from their sins – even by becoming flesh and blood! It is something to shout about – actually, that's what many did 2,000 years ago.

It started with the angel proclaiming to Joseph, 'She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' (Matt. 1:22)

Then the kings from the east declared their intention to worship this new born king to Herod, 'For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.' (Matt. 2:2)

And after the shepherds had seen the new born Saviour 'the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen...' (Luke 2:20)

So what can you do? As a Church we will have various events that you can be involved in:

- There will be invitations to the Carol service and Christmas Day service needing to be distributed. You could give one to a friend, relative, or neighbour. Certainly, we will need willing people to distribute leaflets to surrounding roads in Dunstable.
- Friends and Neighbours will be having a special Christmas lunch on Thursday 14th December. They will also have a choir singing to the visitors and giving a brief Christmas message. They would really appreciate your prayers for this event.
- There will be an open-air carol service being held in the Quadrant on Saturday 16th December. You would be welcome to come along to sing carols and hear the gospel preached to those who stop. We will meet at the Quadrant at 11am and it will last until 12pm.
- The same evening we will also be seeking to reach those who are both homeless and impoverished by holding a special meal for them. Prayer for this would be hugely valued and if you are willing to provide food then this too would be helpful.
- Of course, there are other personal things you can do from sending someone a Christmas card with a leaflet or having a neighbour or colleague over for an early Christmas lunch to share something of the Christmas message with them.

My greetings to you all in Christ our wonderful Lord.



It was a joy for some of us to be at the Annual residential conference of the Slavic Gospel Association held at Milton Hill House near Abingdon and to meet with friends and acquaintances from various churches around the country. We were blessed with good food both spiritual and physical and heard up to date reports of gospel work in Eastern Europe and Central Asia, both from Staff members and also Pastor Peter Mihalchiuk from Moldova and Pastor Alexander Karvakov from Kazakhstan. One particular report and power point presentation of the devastation and deprivation in the war torn areas of Ukraine caused a few tears at what some of God's people are having to endure. However we rejoiced to hear

that God is at work in these areas and souls are coming to faith in Christ and being

baptised.

Bible ministry was provided by Pastor Paul Mallard (Widcombe Baptist Church, Bath) from 1 Kings 17, 18 and 19, and the life of Elijah under the headings of -

God's Word in Dark Days, God's Power in Desperate Days and God's Grace in Disappointing Days. The messages were both encouraging and also challenging with application to the days in which we now live and the circumstances Christians are having to face.

Paul Mallard is no stranger to suffering both in regard to his wife Edrie and more recently his baby grandson. He has written several books including 'Invest your Suffering' and a new

one out in March 'Invest your Disappointments'. Both of these are available from our own Christian Bookshop.
